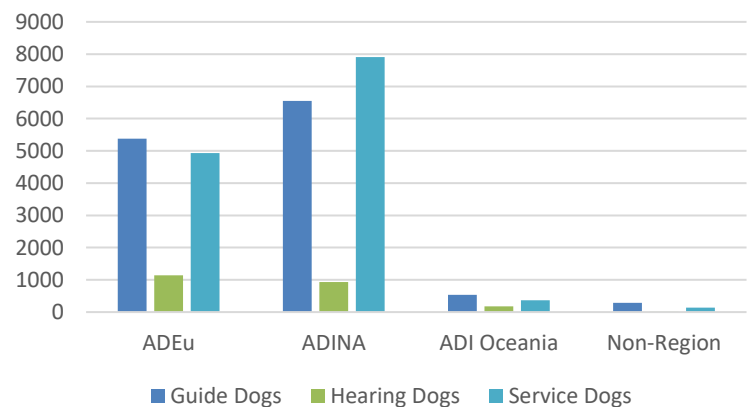

As of 12/31/2022, there are 10,963 dogs/puppies in training with ADI Accredited Member programs with a wait list of 8,955 potential clients.

12 ADI Accredited Member programs state they offer a structured internship program for service dog trainers to the public.

154 Accredited Members. In 2022, the number of programs that train and place:

- 0 – 10 dogs per year: 67
- 11-25 dogs per year: 47
- 26-50 dogs per year: 19
- 51–99 dogs per year: 10
- 100+ dogs per year: 11

In 2022, ADI accredited members placed 4,469 new assistance dog teams.
