OBJECTIVES


- Establish and promote standards of excellence in all areas of assistance dog acquisition, training and partnership

94 ADI Accredited Member programs have breeding programs.

39 ADI Accredited Member programs utilize shelter/rescue programs.

109 ADI Accredited Member programs will consider receiving breeder donations.

As of 12/31/2024, there are 12,450 dogs/puppies in training with ADI Accredited Member programs with a wait list of 7,614 potential clients.

18 ADI Accredited Member programs state they offer a structured internship program for assistance dog trainers to the public.

170 Accredited Members. In 2024, the number of programs (percentage) that train and place:

• 0-10 dogs per year: 81 (48%)

• 11-25 dogs per year: 49 (29%)

• 26-50 dogs per year: 21 (12%)

• 51-99 dogs per year: 10 (6%)

• 100+ dogs per year: 9 (5%)

In 2024, ADI accredited members placed 4,498 new assistance dog teams.
