

44 ADI Accredited member programs operate a prison-based training program within 135 prisons that includes 1,509 puppies/dogs in training.

ADI Accredited Member Programs employ 3,795 Full-time employees and 1,535 Part-time employees.

38,652 Volunteers are assisting ADI Accredited Member programs.

70 ADI Accredited Member programs have breeding programs.

34 ADI Accredited Member programs utilize shelter/rescue programs.

88 ADI Accredited Member programs will consider receiving breeder donations.

As of 12/31/2019, there are 12,073 dogs/puppies in training with ADI Accredited Member programs with a wait list of 6,650 potential clients.

13 ADI Accredited Member programs state they offer a structured internship program for service dog trainers to the public.

133 Accredited Members. In 2019, the number of programs that train and place:

- 0 – 10 dogs per year: 55
- 11-25 dogs per year: 39
- 26-50 dogs per year: 15
- 51–99 dogs per year: 11
- 100+ dogs per year: 11

In 2019, ADI accredited members placed 4,795 new assistance dog teams.
